Junior Members Are Guests Of Durham Woman's Club

DURHAM (E-R) - Durham Woman's Club had as its special guests members of the Durham Junior Women's Club at its March 13 meeting in Memorial

The Juniors were hosted to a potluck dinner and heard a special guest speaker, Mrs. Betty Thompson of Sinai, state chairman, California Federation of Women's Clubs.

Mrs. Thompson's theme was "Yours, Mine, Ours," and spoke of the educational problems being felt by all school districts in California. She noted that one of the main problems is finance and the inequality of education provided students from rich districts as compared to poorer districts. In many areas, teachers have 35 students in a class at the elementary school level, making it difficult to teach the fundamentals of reading so important to progress in all areas of lear-

She noted three areas that parents can help. First, in understanding the problems of their own areas. By assessing their schools, knowing the teachers, board members, and seeing their problems parents can determine what areas need help. Second, by encouraging programs in the schools such as scholarship and education venereal disease and drug education. Third, by helping the schools in areas as tutoring or teacher aides.

She finished her talk by noting that "you are never too old to learn." She used as an example, senior citizens living on a fixed income and trying to cope with the rise in living costs. Classes for these people are needed to help them learn how to live on their income successfully. She encouraged going -back to school, even if just pleasure classes as painting or photography. "Listen to the young people," she noted. "They are your kids, our kids, our future."

Also on the agenda for entertainment was the Durham High School chorus under the direction of Margie Schuler. The group presented three numbers, "Hi Ho," "Going Out of my Head," and "You'll Never Walk Alone."

The business meeting was opened by Mrs. Bernice Abshier, president of the Durham Woman's Club, followed by an inspiration by Mrs. Albertine Cain. It was announced that a total of \$725 had been received to this date for the Durham Volunteer Fire Department from the Mexican dinner jointly sponsored by the two groups. Mrs. Blanch Gardner was presented a trophy stating her as "World's Greatest Salesman" for selling \$108 worth of tickets to the dinner. Mrs. Judy Petrucelli, cochairman of the Mexican dinner, thanked the groups for their help and cooperation.

It was noted that the Shasta District CFWC convention will be April 12-13, in Redding at the Holiday Inn this year. All members were urged to attend.

A report for the nominating committee was given. Nominated for office next year were Mrs. Abshier, president; Mrs. Frances Olsen, secretary; Mrs. Betty Buskirk, treasurer; and Mrs. Cain, auditor.

It was noted that the Durham Volunteer Fire Department will be holding a Bean Feed and Dance on March 23 at the Durham Memorial Hall. There would be a work session at the hall at 1:30 p.m. to assist with the preparations for the dinner.

Under introductions, special guests included, Mrs. Judy Wagoner, recording secretary, CFWC Junior Membership, Mrs. Donna Christopherson, Americanism chairman, CFWC-JM; Mrs. Peggy Norlie, president of the Durham Junior Women's Club; and Mrs. Marge Coon, Shasta District president, CFWC. Visitors attending the meeting and introduced were Mrs. Grace Viola, Mrs. Frances Goettsche, Kathy Johnson and Pauline Miller.

Prior to adjournment Mrs. Alys Walters won a painting donated by Mrs. Frances Stephens. Proceeds of \$70 from the painting project sales will go into a scholarship fund.

Date February 10, 1994

Dear Sir:

We understand that upon contributing \$68.00, the Forest Service, as part of its regular reforestation program, will plant trees on about one acre in a National Forest in California.

The Forest Service will provide to the plantation the same protection from fire, insects and other hazards given other National Forest areas. The plantation will be marked with a standard Forest Service sign. We desire the name of our organization, as contributors, to appear on the sign as follows:

DURHAM EASTSIDE SOCIAL CLUB

(Each contributing organization will be listed only once at any plantation. The name of any individual member of an organization will be shown only on the PENNY PINES Certificate.)

The plantation will be the property of the people of the United States as a part of the National Forest in which it is located and subject to multiple use management.

It is understood that each contribution of \$68.00, or multiple thereof, will be made payable to USDA—FOREST SERVICE and mailed to Penny Pines Coordinator, U.S. Forest Service, 630 Sansome Street, San Francisco, California 94111. Such contribution is for deposit to a Cooperative Work Fund as authorized by the Act of June 30, 1914 (16 U.S. C. 498) and is to remain available until expended to assist in the reforestation of National Forest lands.

It is understood that no Member of or Delegate to Congress or Resident Commissioner, shall be admitted to any share or part in this agreement, or to any benefit that may arise therefrom and that the accomplishment of the Forest Service's share of this agreement is contingent upon the appropriation of funds by Congress.

This agreement covers the initial and any subsequent contributions which may be made by the contributor during the period of this agreement. The period of this agreement shall be from the date shown until cancelled by written notice from one party to the other.

Representatives of the U.S. Forst Service, McCloud Ranger Disict, Women's Clubs, Garden Clubs and individual contributors from forthern California will gather in fcCloud to dedicate the Bigelow enny Pines Plantation at 11 a.m. on pril 8.

The Bigelow Plantation encomasses 35 acres and is located approximately five miles from Mcloud. The area will be planted with everal native species of trees. A gn was installed identifying the igelow Penny Pines Plantation, and individual plaques acknowledge ach contributor.

The Penny Pines Movement was started by the Sportswomen's Club of San Francisco 55 years ago. One year later Penny Pines was adopted as a part of the program of the California Federation of Women's Clubs. In 1941 the McCloud Women's club paid for 1,000 trees to be planted.

The aim of Penny Pines is to promote additional public understanding of the needs for reforestation and the conservation and wise use of our natural resources. Working together, the USFS and contributors have established plantations all over the country.
